Master of Ceremonies

The Honorable Michael Williams Distinguished Leader-In-Residence University of North Texas at Dallas

Michael Williams has served Texas and the nation in a remarkable and spirited public service career spanning more than 40 years that encompasses significant contributions, ranging from serving as a federal prosecutor with the US Department of Justice, to heading the Office of Civil Rights at the US Department of Education, to leading two



Texas state agencies, all while breaking racial barriers and providing insightful leadership and thoughtful perspective.

Williams' career has placed him squarely in the role of a number of groundbreaking firsts. He currently is the inaugural Distinguished Leader in Residence at the University of North Texas at Dallas. From 2012-2016, he became the only black commissioner of the Texas Education Agency, overseeing pre-kindergarten through high school education for more than five million students. And from 1999 - 2011 Williams became the only black American in Texas history to be elected to the Executive Branch of the Texas state government as the Texas Railroad Commissioner (Oil and Gas).

The son of retired, dedicated public school teachers, Williams narrates children's books, is a past Honorary State Chairman of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Texas and Chairman of the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission. He has established endowed scholarships at the University of North Texas at Dallas and his beloved alma mater, the University of Southern California, where he earned a Bachelor's, Master's and law degree.

Williams and his best friend, Donna, have been married 37 years.

Valery enrolled in a NFTE class when she was a freshman in high school (NFTE class of 2010). She learned the basics of entrepreneurship and she came up with an idea for a unique balloon business: her balloons contained a natural rose inside them and were intended to be given as a romantic gift. She named her business



Rosealloon and in time expanded her product line to include other surprising gifts inside a balloon. When asked how these things get inside the balloon, she exclaims, "That's the magic!"

Although she was pleased to place second in a regional business plan and pitch competition, she could not participate in nationals due to personal reasons. However, she applied the lessons she learned to develop her business and that turned out to be worth a lot more than a trip to New York. When her father lost his job and could not make ends meet, he immersed himself in his daughter's business and started selling Valery's unique balloon creations himself. That helped pay the rent and saw the family through some very difficult times.

Valery says that she is forever grateful to NFTE for what it has done for her and for her family. "NFTE didn't leave me alone. I got ongoing mentorship and guidance," she recalls. As she continued her business, she won EY's Youth Entrepreneur of Year award. She also used her NFTE experience on her college and scholarship applications — and was accepted to UNT Dallas with a \$25,000 scholarship. In 2019 she graduated from UNT Dallas with her Bachelor's degree in Finance, becoming the first in her family to graduate college.

Today, she is a Senior business advisor at EY and continues to give back to NFTE, saying that her goal is to inspire other students who come from lowincome communities to think with an entrepreneurial mindset and to aim high. She believes everything is possible for those who are willing to work hard for their dreams.
