



Rommie Hooper attributes much of his personal success to comic books, and appreciates how they can connect him to people of different cultures and backgrounds. He founded Compel Comics, a publishing entity focused on character development in an ever-evolving world, with a goal of audience inclusion and relatable real-



world adversities. Kids deal with gang activity, addiction, and poverty, and Compel Comics tackles these issues and more, to help empower them and give them a leg up on the systems influencing their lives.

Rommie was selected to travel to Cambodia for a month last summer with a group of other volunteers who then created and presented workshops for Cambodian children to learn English and about the environment. While they were also learning about the culture and history of Cambodia, he and the other volunteers took advantage of opportunity to travel to other cities and explore on the weekends. Since competing in the NFTE National Challenge lin October 2023, Rommie has been developing his YouTube channel as well as his videography skills. After high school, he plans to focus on his business and continue building his visual skills.




